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

## Win Rates on Preliminary Injunctions



# Changes in Win Rates 2000-2013

- Rising: Plaintiff Preliminary Injunction Win Rates in trademark cases nationwide have risen from around 60% in 2000 to almost 70% in 2013
- Falling: Defendant Preliminary Injunction Win Rates over the same period fell slightly (30% to 25%), with much variation year-to-year

# Changes in Number of Decisions: 2000-2013

- Nationwide, the number of trademark preliminary injunction decisions has fallen significantly from 2000 to 2013
- Plaintiff motion decisions have fallen from almost 500 to just over 300 per year
- Defendant motion decisions are relatively flat
