

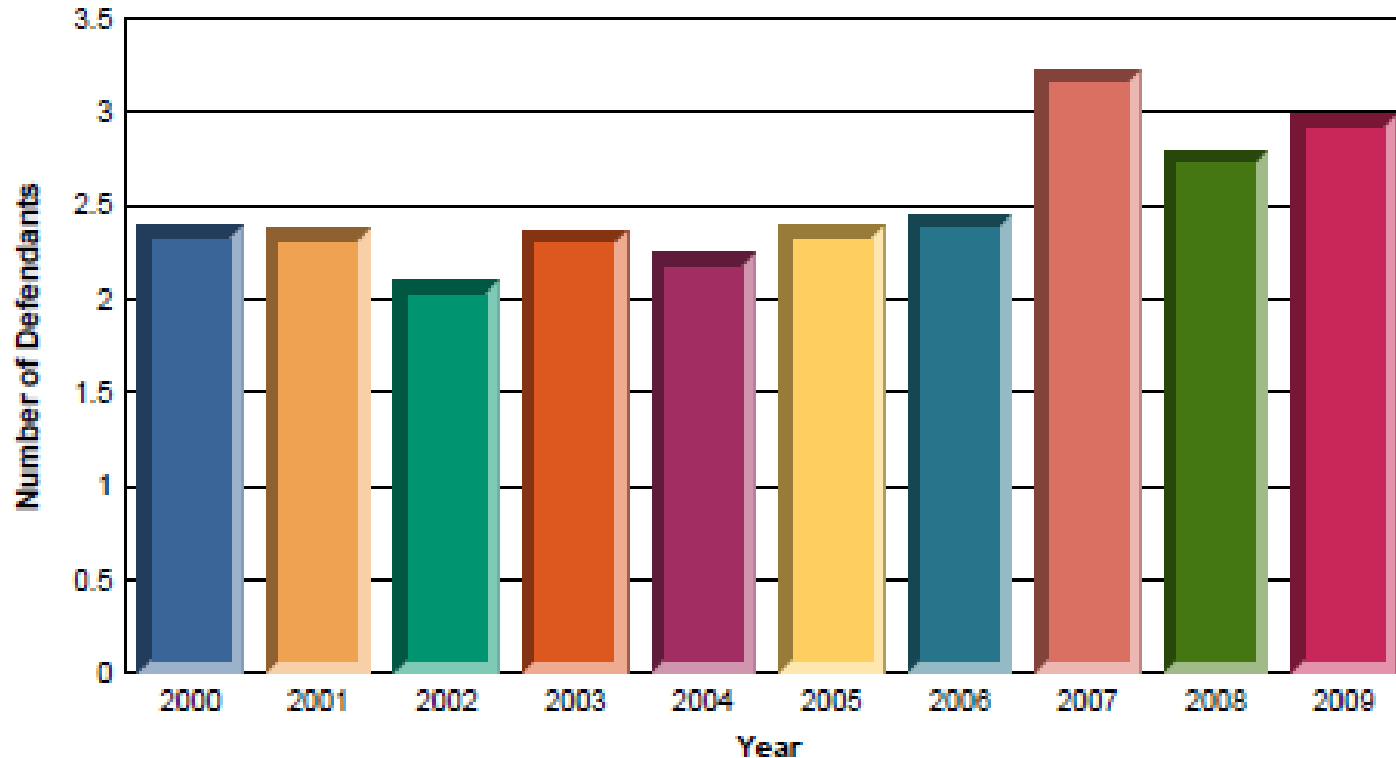

Nationwide: Average Number of Defendants

Average Number of Defendants, by Year

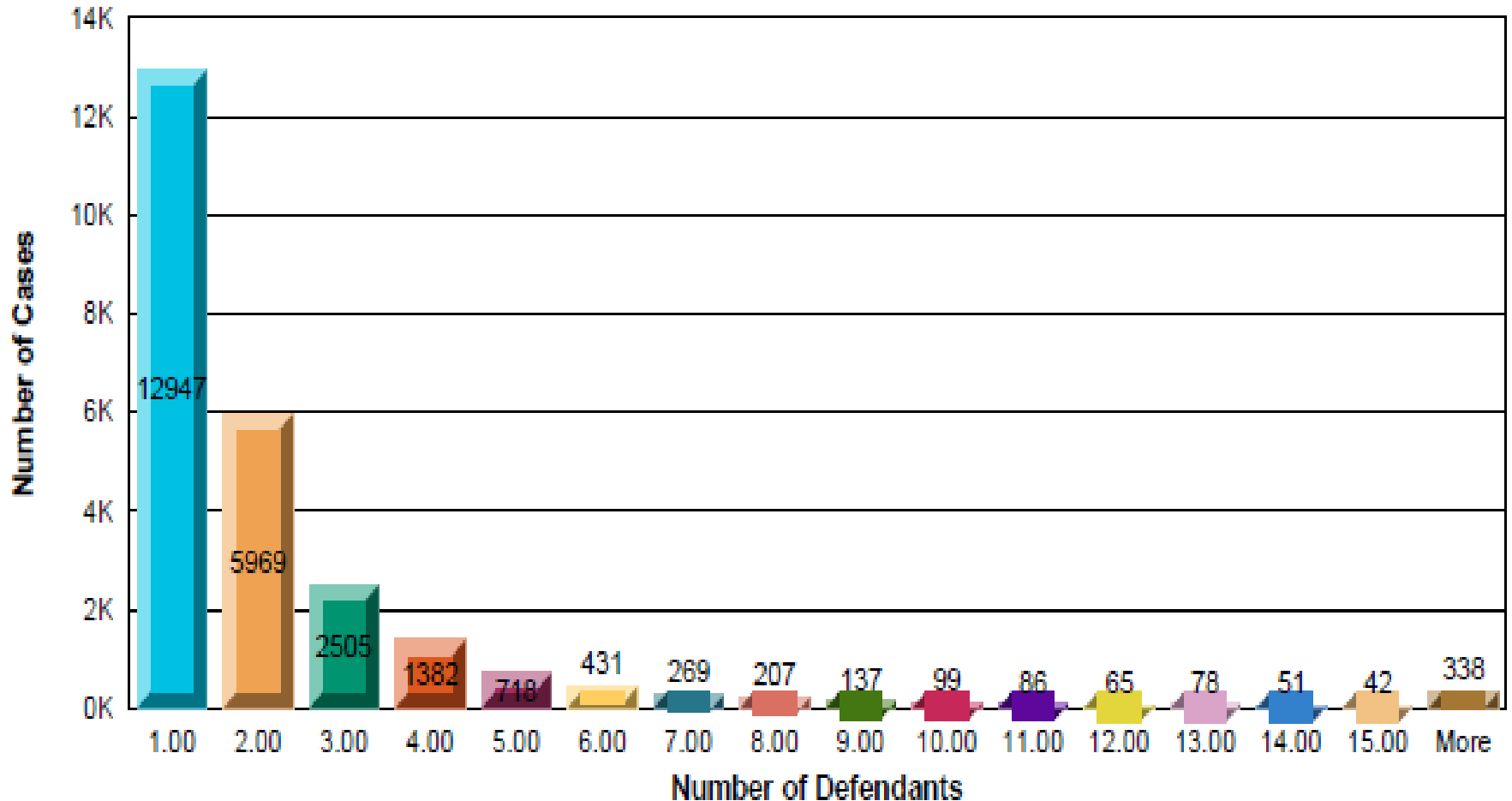


Nationwide: Average Number of Defendants

- From 2000 through 2009, the average number of defendants in patent cases, as filed was 2.6
- For the entire period, the average varied from just over 2 (2002) to just over 3 (2007)
- There seems to a slight upward trend nationwide in number of defendants per case

Nationwide: Number of Defendants

Number of Cases with Specified Number of Defendants



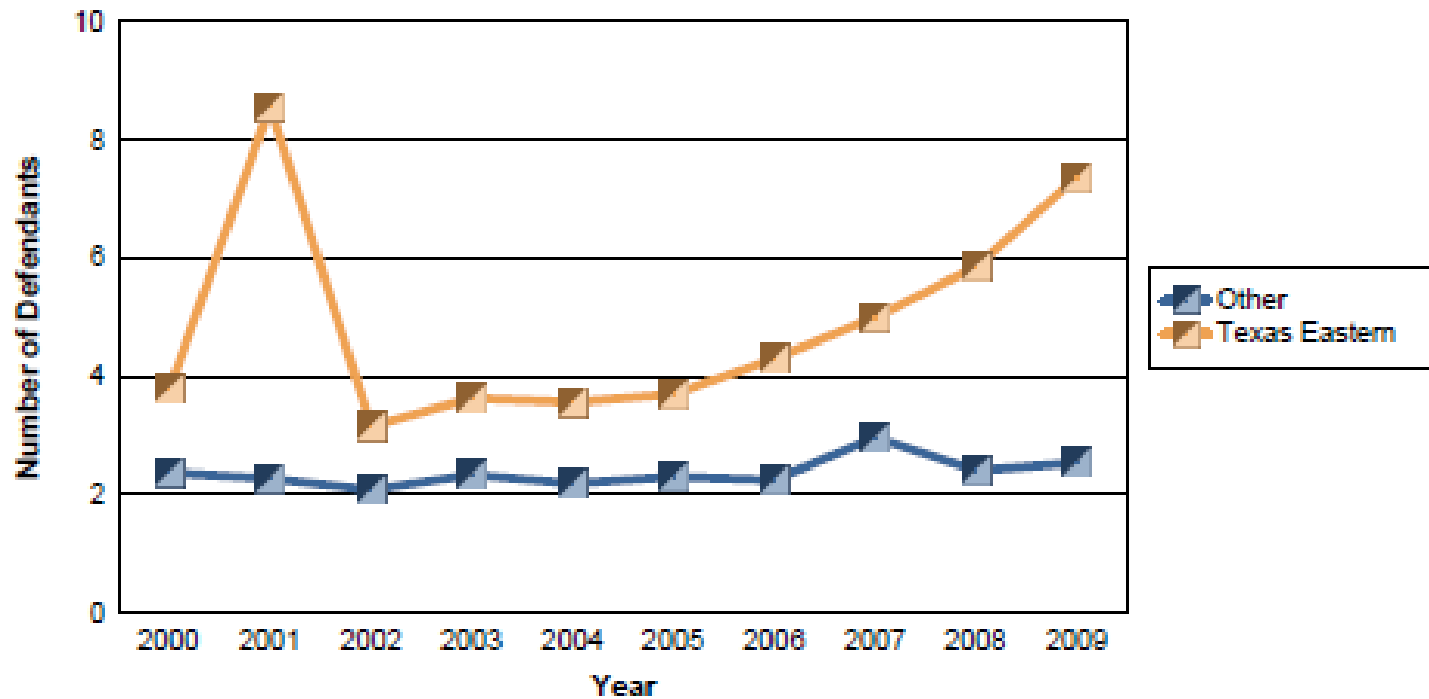
Nationwide: Number of Defendants

- For the entire period, the largest number of cases involved just one defendant
- The number of cases with 2 defendants was roughly $\frac{1}{2}$ the number with 1 defendant
- A significant number of cases had more than 15 defendants

Texas Eastern v. All Other Districts



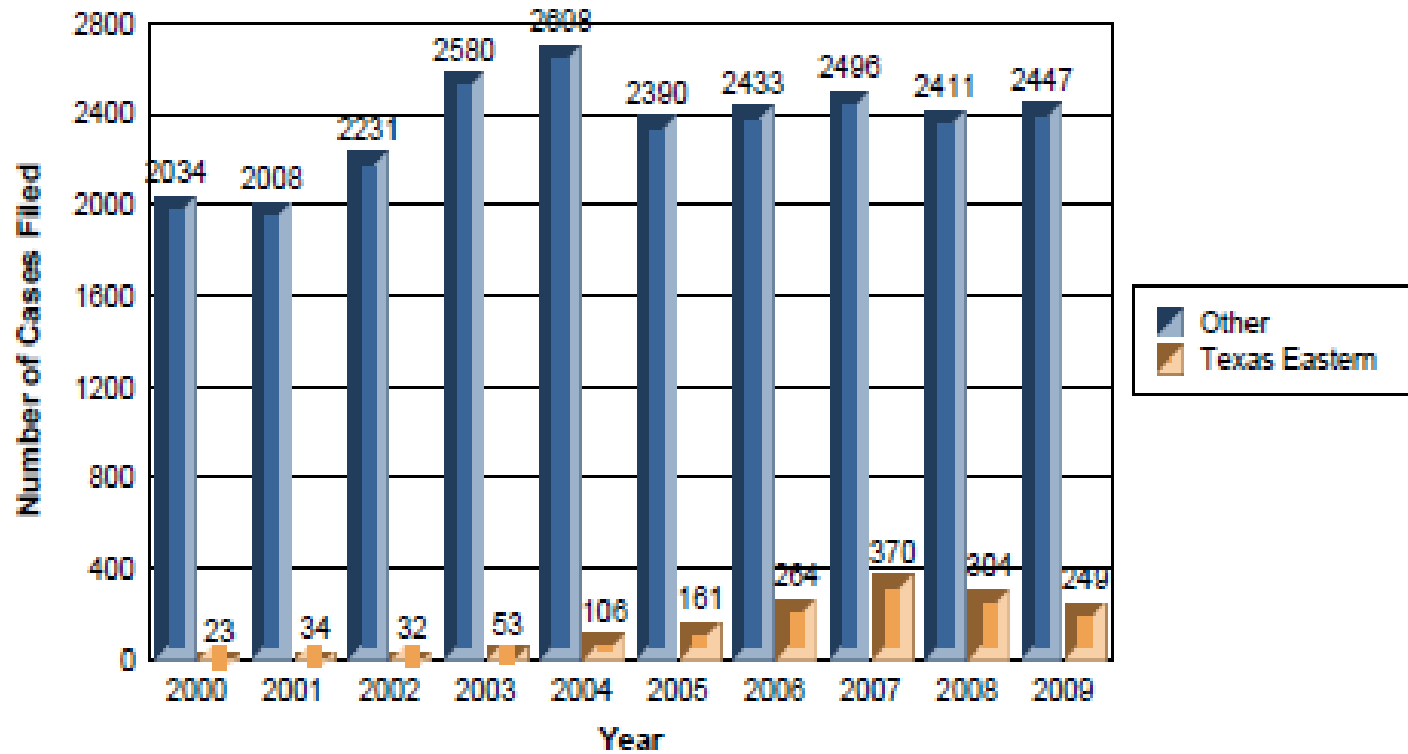
Number of Defendants in Texas Eastern District

- The average number of defendants in the Eastern District of Texas exceeds the average number in all the other districts consistently from 2000 through 2009.
- Since 2004, the average number of defendants in the Eastern District of Texas has shown a gradual increase.
- The figure for 2001 may in part be a result of the relatively small number of cases filed in that year, compared to other years (see below)
